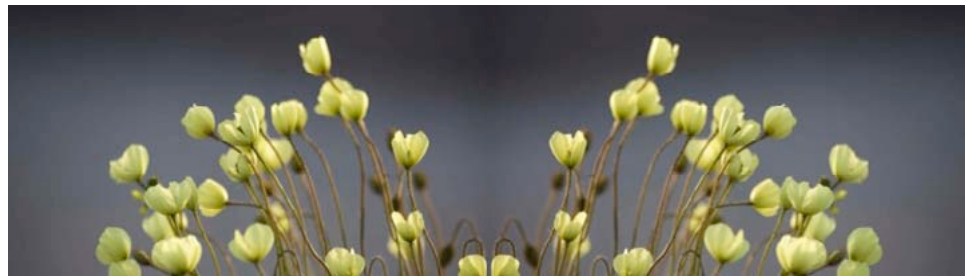

## Local Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Committees: we need you!

## Teachers' Professional Improvement Fund

**Plan B** – For any successfully completed and credited university courses within the year, teachers may apply for reimbursement of tuition fees, up to a maximum of \$2,000 per year. Official transcripts and original receipts must be submitted.

**Plan C** – Teachers may apply for funding to participate in a conference or workshop relevant to their assignment. For conferences held between October and December, applications must be approved by the school principal and have to be received by HR no later than September 15, 2014. To be

eligible, the teacher must have at least one year of service with the KSB. Click [here for more information!](#)

## Exams on Language of Instruction

For the second time last year, the exam on language of instruction was administered on-site, in Nunavik. This exam allows eligible teachers and teachers certified outside the province of Quebec to obtain their teaching authorization from the Ministère de l'éducation, du loisir et du sport (MELS) of Quebec, without having to travel outside Nunavik. In 2013, 28 eligible teachers registered and took the exam locally. Last year, 33 eligible teachers registered for the exam. We are hopeful that once again this year, we will be allowed to administer this exam locally, in the spring of 2015.

## Recruiting School Administrators

During the upcoming Regional Pedagogical Days in Kuujuaq and Puvirnituaq, Stéphane Boulanger, Assistant Director of Human Resources, will be on site to meet with teachers who might be interested in becoming a school administrator for KSB. ## Your documents

KSB maintains a personnel file for each employee, which contains the documents that you have provided us as well as the documents and communications we have sent you. This file, however, is not an archiving

service. Therefore, we suggest that you to keep a copy of all the documents you either sent to us or you have received from us.

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# GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

## Compassionate Schools

The Compassionate Schools project aims at facilitating the social, emotional and academic success of our students. Simultaneously, the project also seeks to provide maximum support to our teachers.

Launched as a pilot project in 2012-2013, the Compassionate Schools approach has yielded positive outcomes.

Indeed, participating schools have noted a decrease in the number of students expelled from classrooms, the strengthening of teachers' classroom management skills and an improved school climate.

As a result of such outcomes, the project has grown and is now implemented in nine of our schools.

The Compassionate Schools project is rooted in three core objectives.

1. Raise awareness and provide information on how trauma impacts behaviour and learning abilities.
2. Support the implementation of "Positive Behaviour Intervention and Support Plans" by participating schools.
3. Provide coaching to staff of participating schools, in particular in the area of classroom management.

New this year, under the coordination of Luc Paquet, the project team will benefit from the support of two energetic pedagogical counsellors: Véronique Charette and Gillian Warner. The latter bring with them a wealth of Nunavik teaching and classroom management experience.

Véronique and Gillian will provide on-site technical support, expertise and coaching to staff of all the participating schools.

Implemented in three schools during 2012-2013 (Kangiqsualujuaq and Kuujuaq), the project was extended to two additional schools in 2013-2014 (Kangiqsujuaq and Umiujaq). This year, four new schools will be added, thus including the communities of Akulivik, Kangirsuk and Salluit.

## SCHOOL OPERATIONS

Prior to the official start of the school year, our school administrators participated in a week of training workshops and orientation meetings (Estérel, August 4-8, 2014). In Kuujjuaq, a similar training and orientation program was offered to new teachers, from August 11 to 15.

Nunavik schools started operating on August 18, 2014. With schedules varying from community to community, schools opened their doors to students between August 19 and 21.

To everyone's delight, the Healthy School budget has been renewed again this year!

The Healthy School approach means building on education and prevention as regards sexual education, physical activity, mental health, well-being and safety.

Schools will soon be informed of available budget for projects. They will receive funding application form and documentation on the food offer for schools.

This year, thanks to funding of the "Drop the Pop" activity, each school will receive an ingenious bicycle used to concoct fruit smoothies!
